THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Wreath has been in use for centuries in the Christian church. It has its origin in the German home and church. The practice spread to England and other countries. Our Advent Wreath is rich with symbolism. Some are obvious and others more obtuse.

- The wreath is unending as is God's love for us.
- The base is constructed from evergreens Holly (sign of the crown of thorns), Boxwood and Fir (signs of the everlasting quality of God).
- Straw symbol of the Nativity of our Lord.
- Pomanders (Apples studded with Cloves). The Apple symbol of original sin, and the Cloves & Cinnamon – symbol of the death and burial of Jesus.
- The Orange Peel represents the bitter gall of the Crucifixion.
- The English Ivy and the Heather are incorporated to share our communion with the Anglican Church.
- The Grapevine and wheat are symbols of the Eucharist.
- The Pine Cones and Pomegranates are a symbol of the Resurrection breaking forth from the tomb.
- All of these surround the Christ Candle in the center The Light of the World.

An Advent Wreath Prayer

O God, rejoicing, we remember the promise of your Son. As the light shines forth from this candle, may the blessing of Christ come upon us, brightening our way and guiding us by his truth. May Christ our Savior bring life into the darkness of our world, and to us, as we wait for his coming. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

GENERAL INFORMATION FORTHIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:
