### **GENERAL INFORMATION FORTHIS MORNING**

**Welcome** to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- Worship as a Family (all ages): At St. Paul's, we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in third grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service.
