1 John 3:1-10, Psalm 23, & John 10:11-16

Grace and Peace to You All,

First off, on behalf of our staff, vestry and myself, we would like to thank you for your continued support of St. Paul's Church. Your time, talent, and treasure are what a friend of mine once called "muscle for ministry."

We have much about which to be thankful. For the first time in 18 years, we can say we are a debt-free church! We ended the budget year of 2017 in the black for the first time in many years, giving away a tithe (10%) of all we received to help relieve suffering and spread the Gospel locally and globally. The first quarter of 2018 is not so hopeful. Please read the report in our Sunday News bulletin.

What are the factors for this fall off? The current cloud of lawsuits hanging over us? Anxiety over our money being seized by the National Episcopal Church? Unrest over the new tax laws? Let me just say, our prayers and love go out to you if you are suffering from stress caused by any of these.

Allow me to bring a few words of comfort:

- ✤ The lawsuits are coming to an end soon. In the meantime, we assure you that NO GIFTS given for the church's ministry will be used for legal defense. We have developed a separate Legal Defense Fund to which people may voluntarily give if they choose.
- ✤ T.E.C. cannot get to our present funds because we use them for mission and ministry each month. We are a month to month operation that depends of the generosity of our saints.
- ✤ The future of our church is rock solid. Chances are quite good that, even if we lose in court, we will have an opportunity to negotiate a deal for our present properties. However, whether we stay or go, "God has a plan for us...plans for good and not to harm...to give us a future and a hope (Jeremiah 29:11)."
- If you have been giving for the benefit of a tax write-off, I would encourage you to ÷ examine your motivations. Jesus called us to such examination saying, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be as well (Matthew 6:21)." Pray about where your heart is and seek to grow in faithful stewardship. Allow the Lord to be your primary motivation.

St. Paul reminds us, "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (II Corinthians 9:7)

We are a blessed church with many wonderful ministries and amazing people. Your gifts are the "muscle" for that ministry! If you are not currently contributing toward the Lord's work at St. Paul's, prayerfully consider starting. If you are able to increase your giving, don't let fear of anxiety hold you back. Let's all push forward together with glad and generous hearts for God's great glory by reversing this current trend!
