## Fifth Sunday of Easter

1 John 3:11-24, Psalm 66:1-11, & John 14:15-21

Dear Parish members:

We are implementing a few common sense actions that will significantly improve safety and security on campus and especially during Sunday services. While there has been no elevation of threat levels in Summerville or the surrounding areas, we believe that it is time to quietly take prudent steps that will deter or prevent a security incident.

The Vestry established a Security Committee and initial recommendations have been made and approved. This is a three-pronged approach:

- 1) Improving physical security by upgrading several door lock functions.
- 2) Establishing deterrence and quick reaction ability in coordination with the Summerville Police Department.
- 3) Finally reducing the number of open or unobserved doors during Sunday services and establishing security-oriented procedures for ushers.

We do not think it prudent to specify all the details in the bulletin, if you have specific concerns please contact the Security Committee via Rick Martier or Fred Hoose. We will continuously seek security improvements balanced with a warm and welcoming environment. Beginning Sunday, May 6th you may see:

- A uniformed police officer walking the campus, and/or a police cruiser conspicuously parked
- Peripheral doors of Doar Hall that are locked to the outside but unlocked inside after services have begun. Signage will be posted directing people arriving late to enter via the two "main front" doors.
- In subsequent weeks you will find that some doors in Skardon Hall, and the Sacristy door in the Church Building will have hardware installed that will automatically lock the doors to the outside while remaining unlocked from the inside.
- In mid-May, the locks on doors will be re-keyed. Those parishioners who need access to Church buildings on a regular basis will need to see the Parish Administrator. More information on accessing new keys will be communicated soon.

Again, we are not aware of any elevated threat levels in the area. The Security Committee is exercising due diligence that will significantly improve safety and security of our parishioners, clergy, and staff.

## GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

**Welcome** to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

• **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings, therefore children in third grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not comfortable with this, please know that we understand and recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest about successful family worship.

• **Kids Church (K3 -2nd grade)** starts the same time as "big church" so bring your child to the Worship Center prior to the service start time. There you will find computers to sign in your children. There will be one computer for families attending services in Doar Hall and another for families attending services in the Church building. Please use the appropriate computers. They will print color coordinating name labels so that our little ones are taken to the correct service.

• Once they enter the Worship Center they will find lots of friendly faces welcoming them along with activity centers that will start their lesson time. They will continue with these until the sermons have ended:

✚ If you are attending the Church building service, please pick your child up at the end of the sermon.

✚ If you are attending the Doar Hall service, please look for your child entering the sanctuary and wave to them so they can find you.

**Communion**—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

**Giving**—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul's does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.

**Giving Envelopes**—are available for your convenience. You may pick up a pack in the church office, in the back of Doar Hall, or the Church Building.

## VESTRY PERSON OF THE MONTH

Rick Martier was born in Kingstree, SC and graduated from Hanahan High School, and he attended the University of South Carolina. He was awarded the Distinguished Naval Graduate Award affording him a Regular Commission in the United States Navy upon graduation. He earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Finance and Management from USC, and a Master of Arts Degree in Economics from the University of Oklahoma.

Rick was a career Naval Officer amassing more than 4000 flight hours, and over 200 Carrier arrested landings. He was ordered the preponderance of his career at Naval Air Stations Miramar, and Point Mugu in Southern California. He was awarded eighteen Medals, Decorations, and Campaign Ribbons during his Service. Rick flew combat missions during the Gulf War, and the ongoing Global War on Terrorism. Rick is currently employed by SAIC as the Workforce Development Manager for the Logistics, Readiness, & Sustainment Market Segment. He has been married to his wife Kim for 29 years and has two sons, Richard and Dalton.
