When Danielle I and moved to Summerville in 2011, it was a new chapter in our life. After serving 29-years in the U.S. Air Force, we knew (after 6 moves to various states and countries over the last 11 years) that we had found a home where we would set our roots. Of the many decisions we needed make, none was more important than finding a church home that was biblically centered with a strong outreach program in the local community.



On the first Sunday, after moving in, we set off in search of that church. St. Paul’s Summerville happened to be the first one on Danielle’s list. The very moment we arrived, people came up and welcomed us very warmly. Our first service was remarkable. The clergy were welcoming and friendly and we knew that St. Paul’s inspired us deeply. I was struck by how the passages of the bible were not just read—they were actually explained in a way that we could understand. The Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit—in a manner we never heard before. We never consulted our list of churches again because we found our church home.

No matter what is on the horizon for us, we are always welcomed at the Lords table, here at St. Paul’s. In 2014, I had a medical issue that tested my faith. But, with loving prayers from my family, visits from clergy in the hospital and the prayers from the St. Paul’s congregation, I know that the Holy Spirit’s healing powers descended on me and I’ve been in remission these past years. Our clergy, led by Tripp, will provide the church with inspirational direction for our church. We know that our decision to become members of St. Paul’s was really not our own, it was God inspired.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul’s! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul’s we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings; therefore, children in third grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not comfortable with this, please know that we understand. We recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We’re here to help, so don’t hesitate to ask a priest about successful family worship.
- **Kids Church** (ages 3 –7) Sign-in for Kid’s Church will be in St. Paul’s Central of Doar Hall. Sign them in before service starts with Mrs. Shannon or the volunteer. Children will remain in the worship service until after the collect. After the collect, we invite your children to meet Mrs. Shannon at the front of the church. Mrs. Shannon will take the children to Kid’s church. The children will be escorted to St. Paul's Central during the offertory. At that time, parents please come to the doors and show your security tag to pick your child up. Children will be seated in their age groups for convenience.

Once your child enters the Children's Worship Center for Children's Church they will enjoy a time of chapel, as well as, a craft and activity that tie into the Bible lesson for the day. Please join our FaceBook page (*St. Paul's Summerville Children's & Faith at Home Ministry*) to see a recap of our morning in Children's church.

✚**Child Check-In—(Birth to Third Grade,** for both the Church Building and Doar Hall) Check-in at the C/Y building or Doar Hall. A volunteer will walk them over to the C/Y Building and a volunteer will bring them back to pick up at the Offertory. Nursery check-in will remain in the C/Y Building at the nursery. You may pick your child up at the end of the sermon, or the end of the service.

✚**Child Pick-up—**Please come to the back door of St. Paul's Central (Doar Hall where you checked in) and present your matching security tag to Mrs. Shannon or a volunteer to pick up your child.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul’s. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul’s.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul’s does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.
