
Please pray now and daily for this season of "Imagine." Please make the time to be a part of this most important season in the life of our parish.

While in Children's Church, your children learn: About bowing when the cross passes and why, as Anglicans, we do this; who the acolytes are; how the colors of the stoles match the liturgical calendar, prayers, etc. Now is a great time to show them what we are going over in Children's Church.
- Sing the songs and pray. Children learn behavior by mimicking you.
