Neighborly Church Planting—Fr. B. Tyler Prescott

St. Paul's church planting team, over the last three months, has spent a good deal of time asking questions as a key part of this discernment process. The goal of the first phase in this church planting process is to discern the culture and values needed for this church to effectively proclaim the Gospel in it's context. To do so, we need to know who we are, who our neighbors are and what the Gospel might have to say through our particular church to our particular neighbors. Therefore, we've been asking questions - of ourselves and our neighbors! First,

we've asked, "What values do we hold that will define our mission and ministry?" These are not matters of belief, like the Holy Trinity or uniqueness of Christ, but principles that are derived from our faith and ministry context that will serve to define the culture of the new church. In defining ourselves from the beginning, we will have clarity about how our church is called to minister and how it is not.

Secondly, we've asked, "Who are the people who live in the communities we are trying to reach?" To answer this question, we have used MissionInsite (a non-profit demographics program) to capture the demographics and growth trends in the area. But even more importantly: We have taken to the streets, to the pools, the local coffee shops and playgrounds, Food Truck Fridays and farmer's markets. We are getting to know our neighbors personally and exploring the physical spaces that have drawn them to these communities. This getting-to-know-you time even includes looking at architecture and neighborhood layouts - much can be learned through these often overlooked details.

As we complete this first phase, we'll begin looking to build a larger, core team that will help launch the church in the future. This team will include folks from every stage of their faith journey and every stage of life. They will share in common a desire to be : Relationally involved (neighborly, if you will!) with the church's community, passionate about mission (not simply a Sunday worship service) and committed to an allhands-on-deck service to the church. If you know of anyone who would like to be a part of something like that—have them contact me!

I've heard from a few people who get excited about this sort of neighborly church vision, but don't feel called to a church plant. Such is the beauty of church planting! That excitement for the Gospel is generated among all ministries and especially at the mother church of the plant. Let us all be in prayer that the Holy Spirit would spur both St. Paul's and her church plant to bring the Gospel into the neighborhoods of Summerville.—**Tyler** 🕆
