Daughters of the King - Mrs. Dawn Schaeperkoetter

The Daughters of the King are Christian women and girls, both lay and ordained, ranging from age seven and up, who desire a closer walk with the Lord, are strengthened through the discipline of a Rule of Life, and are supported through the companionship of our sisters. We are all at different stages of our Christian journey some have just begun and some have been on this path for a long time. But no matter where we are on our sacred journeys, our



primary goal is the same: to know Jesus Christ and to make Him known to others, and to become reflections of God's love throughout the world. To do this we are empowered by the Holy Spirit.

The Order of the Daughters of the King is a Christian order in a greater community of men and women living under a religious rule. Because Daughters accept a Rule of Life, we define ourselves as an order, not an organization. Our community is found primarily in our local chapters, but it extends beyond that to the world. Membership in the Order is open to women at every stage of life. The diversity of different ages strengthens and enriches our adult, or senior, Daughters of the King chapters. Younger women benefit from the discipleship of experienced spiritual mentors, and older women are invigorated by the fresh faith and energy of youth, in true Titus 2:3-5 fashion. Many senior chapters help spread the Kingdom to the next generation by sponsoring and supporting a Junior Daughters of the King chapter at their churches.

We don't just enroll as members and attend meetings. To become a Daughter, a woman undergoes a three-month period of study and discernment. This is because each new member takes vows to uphold the two Rules of the Order: the Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service. A Rule of Life is a selfimposed spiritual discipline practiced daily by an individual, a commitment intelligently and prayerfully considered. A rule of life sets apart an order from other church organizations. Members of the Order undertake a Rule of Life, incorporating the Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service. By reaffirmation of the promises made at Baptism and Confirmation, a Daughter pledges herself to a lifelong program of Prayer, Service, and Evangelism, dedicated to the spread of Christ's Kingdom and the strengthening of the spiritual life of her parish. Each member's personal Rule of Life reflects her unique spiritual journey. A Daughter's Rule of Life is not taken lightly, but is developed prayerfully with God's guidance. The Rule is not meant to be fixed, but flexible, and should be begun simply and reviewed regularly to accommodate her changing life circumstances and spiritual growth. Most Daughters find that the discipline of a Rule of Life fosters a deeper relationship with Christ. The commitment made through our vows often serves as a catalyst that draws us closer to the heart of God--transforming our lives and leading us into more dedicated prayer and service for the sake of the One whose cross we wear.

The 2019 training sessions begin June 16th, but it's not too late to join! Please contact Dawn Schaeperkoetter if interested, and we'll get you started.

We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul's.

TO PARENTS OF YOUNG CHILDREN - Relax! God put the wiggles and sweet little noises in children - don't feel like you have to suppress them in God's house.

- Consider sitting toward the front where children can more easily engage.
- Quietly explain the parts of the service and actions of the priests, musicians, acolytes, and leaders. While in Children's Church, your children learn: about bowing when the cross passes and why, as Anglicans, we do this; who the acolytes are; how the colors of the stoles match the liturgical calendar, prayers, etc. Now is a great time to show them what we are going over in Children's Church.
- Sing the songs and pray. Children learn behavior by mimicking you.
- If you have to leave the worship with your child—please feel free to do so, but please do come back.

NURSERY AND CHILDREN'S CHURCH

Childcare is available for ages birth through 3 years of age. You will find a greeter there to assist you with check-in. We ask that you please check your child in at one of our check-in kiosk located in Doar Hall and in the CY building. There you will receive a matching security tag that will need to be shown when you pick up your child.
